

Compliance Checklist for High-Pressure Operations

Client version — a quick self-audit for decision integrity under pressure.

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Use this checklist to assess whether compliance is structural in your operation. Check what you can confirm today. Missing items indicate where execution drift typically starts.

1) Decision checkpoints High priority

- Critical handoffs have a defined checkpoint (what is decided, by whom, and acceptable range).
- Confirmation is built into the workflow (one step, low friction).
- Accountability is explicit (owner + fallback).

3) Traceability High priority

- Decisions affecting quality have traceable records (time, context, owner).
- Batch/lot context is preserved end-to-end (inputs → decision → outcome).
- Audit exports can be produced on demand.

5) Roles & escalation Medium priority

- Escalation pathways are used in practice (not only on paper).
- Incentives support system outcomes (not hidden workarounds).
- Cross-functional accountability is defined at critical nodes.

2) Signal capture High priority

- Operational adjustments are captured consistently (not left to memory).
- Repeated adjustments trigger a review signal (threshold defined).
- Signals are reviewed on a fixed cadence (weekly or per batch cycle).

4) Fail-safe controls Medium priority

- Non-negotiable limits exist where safety or quality is at risk.
- Escalation is clear when signals spike (who, when, SLA).
- Controls are designed to be easy to use and hard to misuse.

6) Metrics & monitoring Medium priority

- Three KPIs are tracked (rework, delays, repeated overrides).
- Thresholds are visible (green/amber/red) to support fast decisions.
- Corrective actions are assigned and verified (not just discussed).

Rapid self-audit (Yes / No / Partial)

- Do we know exactly where decision drift starts in our workflow?
- Can we produce traceable evidence for key quality decisions quickly?
- When pressure spikes, do escalation paths activate in under 15 minutes?

If "No" appears more than once: the system is relying on people instead of structure.
